



Iowa State Savings Bank, shown here in 1916, was founded in April, 1905, and was located from 1907 to 1917 in what is now the Masonic Temple building on Main Avenue. The building at 122 Main Avenue was constructed by Chicago architect, Harry R. Harbeck. It featured marble counters and grillwork, and still retains many of the original details that lend to its historic significance. Charles Ingwersen was first president and Gustav Gradert served as cashier.

J. H. Peters, president of First National Bank of Lyons, 301 Main Street, owned twenty shares of capital stock valued at \$100 each in 1917.
